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BRIEF HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

Located at Saitsohpen Village, in the lower reaches of the Sohra Plateau, Sohra Government College stands out as the only full-fledged Government institution of higher education in the East Khasi Hills.

Prior to its provincialisation on the 18th February 2009, the College had its humble beginnings, when it was formally inaugurated on the 10th July 1982. The establishment of the College in 1982, was largely due to the farsightedness of the prominent citizens of Sohra area, who foresaw the role of higher education as an instrument for Change. So they, collectively, drummed support from within the community to realized the dream of establishing an institute of higher education in the area. Sohra, it needs be mentioned, has been the centre of learning since yesteryears. The College, from its inception, has aspired to cater to the needs of students from poor economic background, residing in Sohra and the adjoining areas.

The College secured affiliation from the North Eastern Hills University for Pre-University (Arts) on the 2nd December 1986 and Provisional Affiliation for the Degree Courses (Arts) on the 30th January 1993. The College has been listed under 2(f) and 12 (b) only from the 1st October 2005 of the UGC Act, following the approval for Permanent Affiliation which came into effect from the 14th of December 2004.

With the provincialization of the College in 2009, it became a boon as more and more youths from Sohra and the surrounding villages could avail the benefits of securing higher education at an affordable price. The college, which witnessed an enrolment strength of 38 pupils when it was inaugurated in 1982, has moved a long way since. The current enrollment stands at more than 600 students. The College has also seen a marked improvement in its infrastructure, over the years. The College strives to enlighten and empower the students to realize their potential.

It is envisioned that the college will be brought to the forefront of Higher Education in Meghalaya because of the aspirations, efficiency and leadership of the college administration and the commitment, service and flexibility of the teaching and non-teaching staff, support of the parents and the people of Sohra Civil Sub-division, prayer of the employees, the financial support of the state government and the hard work of the students.

The motto 'Progress with Wisdom' conveys the message that the college shall render education that will lead people from ignorance and uplift their well-being.

General Information:

I. Teaching Faculty:

Sohra Government College has qualified faculty members in the different discipline of the Arts stream. There are a total of 31 teaching staffs with a maximum strength of 5 members (sanctioned post) in most of the Departments.

Non-teaching Members: Sohra Government College also possessed an adequate number of non-teaching staff catering to the establishment needs of the College.

II. Computer Network Facilities etc: Sohra Government College is equipped with sufficient computer facilities with a campus wide Wi-Fi network and photocopying facilities at a rate lesser than the available market price.

III. Library Facilities: Sohra Government College is equipped with computerized system and an excellent collection of books, both reference and general, corresponding to the needs and requirements of reading and learning resources. Beside books, the college library also possessed maps, Journals, Newspapers and magazines. The college Library also provides computer with internet facilities to students and staffs. The college library also has access to e-Books and e-Journals through N-List.

IV. Clubs, Committees etc: Apart from curricular activities, Sohra Government College tries its best to cater to the needs of the students. There is the Students' Welfare Committee, The Social and Cultural Committee, the Grievances Committee etc. Besides these, there is the Red Ribbon Club, the National Service Scheme and the National Cadet Corps. V. Application Process:

Admission Forms into first Semester are issued immediately after the announcement of the results of Meghalaya Higher Secondary School Leaving Certificate Examination. Submission of Application Form must be accompanied by

- a. A recent passport size photograph.
- b. An attested copy of the mark sheet of Class XII Board/ University Examination last appeared.
- c. An Attested copy of the Character Certificate from the Head of the Institution last appeared.
- d. Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe /OBC certificate.
- e. Differently-abled persons are to provide attested copy(ies) of relevant documents.
- f. Students coming from other colleges and seeking admission into Sohra Government College should attach Transfer Certificate and permission from the University along with their applications.
- g. Students coming from other Boards or Universities other than MBOSE or NEHU, should submit their Migration Certificate along with their application.

The applications are screened by the Admission Committee constituted by the College.

Selected students are notified and are given admission.

- I. Discipline:
The College maintains a strict disciplinary standard befitting a person for his/her student life:
- Students are to behave in a disciplined manner both in words and action.

Conduct of Examination:

- a. At the end of each Semester there shall be an examination as per the Calendar provided by the North Eastern Hills University.
- b. During the course of the semester, there shall be an internal evaluation of the progress as per the performance of the student. The internal evaluation shall be based on the continuous assessment of each Department.
- c. The marks of the Continuous Assessment shall be added to the end semester examination. The weightage assigned to the Continuous Assessment and End Semester Examinations shall be 25 marks : 75 marks or in the ratio of 1:3.
- d. The pattern and schedule of the Continuous Internal Assessment shall be notified by the Evaluation Committee of the College.
- e. Students shall be allowed to proceed to the next Semester, irrespective of failed papers/ arrear papers, subject to payment of fees and fulfillment of other prescribed conditions laid down by the University.

Economics as a subject discipline was started in Pre-University Course and subsequently Degree Course was initiated when Provisional Affiliation was periodically granted from 1993, until Permanent Affiliation from NEHU was secured on December 2004 to start B.A(Pass) and B.A (Honours) course in Economics. Ever since, the Department has been making a sincere effort of inculcating in the young minds an interest in the subject. Presently, the Department of Economics has a staff faculty of 05 (five) members. Over the years, there has been a good number of students opting for Honours in the subject of Economics. Some have even pursue Masters' Degree Course and others are placed in government services. It is a sincere hope, that more and more students opt for Economics and make a mark for themselves in different fields.

Avenues and Career Prospects: Economics is a dynamic subject equipping the student with knowledge about the changing economic scenarios. A person who wishes to take up Economics as Honours paper, has the advantage in terms of securing opportunities in the following:

The Department of History, is one of the founding departments in the College. The Department of History was started initially as a Pre University(Arts) Course. Provisional Affiliation for starting Degree Course was attained in in 1994, which had to be renewed from time to time. From 2004 onwards Permanent Affiliation was granted for starting BA (Pass) course and BA (honours) Course. The department has seen a number of faculty members since its inception. At present the department has the sanctioned strength of 05 (five) faculty members. Over the years the Department have witnessed a small trickle of students opting for Honours in the subject. With the commencement of the Semester system, in 2015 and the semester system being a complete Honours Degree Programme, the number of students opting for Honours in History, have significantly increased. It is, however, the aspiration of the Department of History to bring more and more students towards this field of discipline, which had over the years seen a challenge, in the sense that students are least incline to opt for it, as a career option. It is the committed vision of the Faculty members, Department of History, to prepare students who have a sound grounding of the Past, and used it as tool for critically assessing their present and be the agents of change in the Society and Country.

Avenues and Career Prospects: History, as a subject is inter-related to other discipline such as Literature, Political Science, Economic and so on, thereby making it relevant to the study of these disciplines. Besides, Honours in History, opens up a wide range of opportunity for the students to;

ENVIRONMENTAL STUDIES

in brief:

The importance of Environment as a subject to be added in the curriculum was felt by the North Eastern Hills University, as early as 2001. This is evident from the fact that a paper was introduced in 2001 for the Final Year Students of the Three Year Integrated Degree Course. The College has a full fledged faculty member handling this particular aspect of providing background information and learning and inculcating a pro-Environment attitude and behavioural pattern in society.

1. Diploma/ Certificate Courses:

Taking a cue from the fact that the area is the centre of culture, filled with talented youths in the field of music, the College is starting a Certificate Course on Khasi Music. The aspiration is to take it to the level of a Degree Course. All the necessary requirements related to the start of the Course has been completed. The Course will be started once approval is obtained from the North Eastern Hills University.

2. Student Support Services:

A. The College has a students's body called the Sohra Government College Students Union, duly recognized by the competent authority(ies). It comprised of the elected members, chosen by the students from among themselves. The Student Body is the official body representing the students in the College.

B. Transport Services:

The College provides a transport facilities for ferrying the students to and from the college, on a daily basis.

C. Counselling and Guidance Cell:

The College has a Counselling and Guidance Cell to deal with any stress related issues that might hamper the positive growth of the student. Necessary guidance are also given from time to time to help students career prospects. Workshops and lectures are conducted to familiarize the students of relevant career options.

D. Grievance Redressal: The College provides facility for addressing the complaint/grievance of any individual students or group of students. A Suggestion Box, meant for grievance redressal is placed in plain view to enable anyone to come forward for mailing their grievances. A Grievance Committee is entrusted to look into, any such cases, of complaint.
